



Butler Elementary School: End of Year LAND Trust Summary Report

Butler Elementary School was allotted **\$74,725** in LAND Trust funds for the 2019-20 school year.

The Butler Elementary School Community Council spent **\$67,253** of \$74,725 in LAND Trust funds for the 2019 - 20 school year. The building leadership team and the school community council determined that funds should be spent to improve student achievement in reading and math. In reading, students were tested using Acadience benchmark assessments. Students performing below benchmark received daily intervention support from intervention assistants under the direction of the achievement coach. Most of the allocated School Land Trust funding (**\$61,084**) was used to hire 8 assistants who provided reading interventions. A total of **\$4,554** was spent on substitutes. These substitutes were utilized to allow teachers to participate in coaching cycles to improve their capacity in whole-group and skill-based reading instruction as well as to provide opportunities for teachers to observe their colleagues at Butler and at other schools in the district. We used an additional **\$1,615** to purchase math manipulatives and supplies to support our “concrete-representational-abstract” teaching model. Our school community council is pleased to be a vital part of planning and overseeing the use of LAND Trust resources. These funds play a vital role in providing targeted support for our most critical needs. Year to year, our data confirms that these efforts provide a positive impact upon student growth and achievement.



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Butler Elementary School Teacher Student Success Plan Goals for 2020 - 2021

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

- 75% of students K-3 will be in the pathway of progress100%
- 80% of 4th & 5th grade students will be proficient on the reading inventory

MATHEMATICS

- By May 2020-21: 80% of students will be at or above benchmark according to their math composite score

SCHOOL CLIMATE

- By May 2020-21: 90% of students surveyed will report that they feel safe at school, feel like they belong and have a meaningful connection with at least one adult in the building.
